

Guidance for the congregation based on preliminary Government advice. We await final advice.

- The whole service will be shared on Zoom which will allow preachers to speak on-line if they wish and others to join us remotely.
- Avoid queueing to get into church, stagger arrival or remain in the car until the queue ends.
 - Consider how you will park and exit your car whilst remaining 2m apart.
- Bring your own bible as no pew bibles will be available.
- Wash your hands or use sanitiser as you arrive and leave.
- Always keep 2 metres (6'0") apart.
- Windows and doors will remain open whilst the main church is in use to increase the airflow.
- Follow the one-way routes.
- Seating is arranged to allow identified household/bubble groups to sit together but 2m from anyone else.
- You will be guided to your seat.
- Stay in your place.
- Do not socialise (chat) with anyone not in your household or bubble until you are outside in the open air.
- There will be one service on Sunday rather than two. Bible study will continue to be on Zoom for now. Later in the year the bible study on Wednesday evening may be held in the main church as there will be over 72 hours between services.
- The congregation is not allowed to sing.
- When leaving follow the exit route on your side of the church.
- We are not able to provide refreshments following the service.
- If you want to bring bottled water, it must be taken home with you.
- The rear hall, kitchen and storeroom will be closed off.
- We believe there is a legal limit of 30 people allowed in the service.
 - If needed, we will stream the service to the rear hall or Sunday school room to provide further space (depending on government advice due shortly).
- Only the new toilet in the front entrance and the disabled toilets will be available.
